BEN ANDERSON

1996 Indiana All-Star, Bloomington H-T 1st team all-state, and AP honorable mention all-state... averaged 20.3 points and 11.2 rebounds as senior for 16-9 sectional champions... set Benton Central records in career scoring (1,541 points), career rebounds (808), FG made (610), career FG% (.679), blocks (261) and season records for FT made (121), FT attempts (163), FG made (208) and FG% (.691)... averaged 19+ points per game as sophomore, junior and senior, earning all-conference and all-area honors and McDonald's All-American nomination... a member of teams that went 62-31, winning two sectional championships... four-year player at Indiana State University, playing in 71 career games with 218 career points and 149 rebounds... senior member of Sycamores' 2000 Missouri Valley Conference champions and NCAA Tournament team... with a degree in construction management, he has worked in that industry and is currently the street commissioner for the city of West Lafayette... he has two children and lives in West Lafayette.

1996 Indiana Mr. Basketball, two-time AP 1st team all-state, three-time IBCA 1st team all-state, two-time Bloomington H-T 1st team all-state and two-time Indianapolis News all-state selection... set Warsaw record of 2,028 career points, along with 365 rebounds, 213 assists and 193 steals in 91 career games... averaged 30.1 points per game as senior, leading Tigers to 25-3 record and state finals appearance... a member of teams that went 76-15, winning three sectionals, two regionals, 1996 semi-state, three conference championships and 1994-95 Hall of Fame Classic... three-time all-conference selection and three-time area Player of the Year, averaging 19+ points as a sophomore, junior and senior... attended Southwest Missouri State University, where he graduated as school's all-time leader in games played (132), career steals (243) and top ten in career points (1,508)... named Missouri Valley all-conference as sophomore, junior member of Bears' 24-10 1999 NCAA Sweet 16 team, 1997 and 2000 NIT teams and was two-time team MVP... earning a business degree, he has worked in the flooring industry since 2001... he is business development manager with Jack Laurie Group, where he has worked the past 13 years... married with three children, he resides in Noblesville.

1996 AP 2nd team all-state, IBCA 2nd team all-state, Bloomington H-T 1st team all-state and Indianapolis News 2nd team all-state... averaged 21.1 points, 4.2 assists and 4.4 steals as senior for 21-2 sectional champions that won the Olympic Conference title and HOF Classic... averaged 19.5 points and 3.4 assists as junior for 20-4 sectional and Olympic Conference champions, 1995 AP honorable mention all-state, IBCA 1st team underclass all-state and Bloomington H-T 1st team underclass all-state... was 1995 and 1996 Muncie Star-Press Player of the Year, 1995 HOF Classic MVP, 1st team all-area... career total 1,332 points... career totals of 1,585 points and 249 steals at Ball State, finishing as 8th all-time leading scorer and 2nd in steals in Cardinals history.... 1997 MAC all-freshman team, 1998 honorable mention all-conference and 1999 and 2000 2nd team all-conference... led BSU in scoring as junior and senior, MAC tournament champions, he was MAC tournament MVP, led Ball State to 2000 NCAA Tournament and is tied for the NCAA tournament record of 8 steals in one game... played professionally in England... he has worked at Muncie schools, including assistant coach at Muncie Central and Muncie Burriss, the Muncie Boys & Girls Club and Youth Opportunity Center and is currently Assistant Director of Admissions with Ivy Tech... married with two children, he resides in Muncie.

1996 Indiana All-Star, AP 2nd team all-state, two-time IBCA 1st team all-state and Indianapolis News 2nd team all-state... averaged 22.0 points, 5.1 rebounds and 2.3 steals as senior for 24-2 Wildkats team that won regional, #1 state ranking and the only undefeated North Central Conference champion in Kokomo boys basketball history... started all 52 games as junior and senior for teams that were 46-6 with two sectional, two regional and two North Central Conference championships and was sophomore member of Kats' 1994 sectional champs... 951 career points in 68 games (14.0 ppg)... averaged 10.1 points per game in 27 games as freshman at Morehead State University before completing career at NAIA Olivet Nazarene University... totaled 1,913 points in three seasons at ONU on teams that went 86-27, winning three conference championships and reaching the 2000 NAIA Final Four... in all, he scored 2,185 points in his college career in 140 games (15.6 ppg)... he was a 2000 NAIA 2nd team All-American, CCAC Conference Player of the Year, was a 1998 2nd team all-conference selection and 1999 and 2000 1st team all-conference... earning a degree in finance and economics, he was a Sr. Vice President at Morgan Stanley for 20 years and is currently a Managing Director with Raymond James... he resides in Ft. Myers, Florida.

1996 Indiana All-Star, two-time AP 1st team all-state, three-time IBCA 1st team all-state, three-time Bloomington H-T 1st team all-state and two-time Indianapolis News 1st team all-state and was 1996 Parade Magazine 3rd team All-American... averaged 21.8 points per game as senior for 22-4 sectional and Northern Indiana Conference champions... set Clay H.S. record of 1,700 career points, averaged 18.9 points as junior for 20-2 team and 17.0 points as sophomore on 27-2 1994 Indiana state champions... a member of teams with 84-15 overall record and 31-4 conference record, two conference titles, two sectional titles and one state championship... started 105 times in 125 games played in career at Purdue University, with career totals of 1,595 points, 390 rebounds, 269 assists and 176 steals... averaged double-figure scoring in each of his four seasons for teams that were 91-43 with four NCAA Tournament appearances, including the 2000 Elite Eight... named team MVP as a junior and two-time 3rd team all-Big Ten selection... he is a mentor & program director for Heroes Camp Inc... he has two children and resides in South Bend.

1996 Indiana All-Star, AP 2nd team all-state, IBCA 2nd team all-state, two-time Bloomington H-T 1st team all-state and Indianapolis News 1st team all-state... averaged 23.0 points, 5 assists and 2 steals per game for 19-2 team his senior season... totaled 1,476 career points, was 1995 & 1996 NWI Times Area Player of the Year and 1996 Gary Post-Tribune Area Player of the Year... averaged 20.9 points and named 1st team underclass all-state as junior for 19-6 sectional champs and averaged 17.2 points as sophomore for 13-12 team that won a sectional championship... started 26 of 27 games played as freshman at Oregon State University before completing eligibility at Purdue... started 75 of 96 games played in three seasons at Purdue... college career totals of 1,289 points, 444 assists and 108 steals in 123 games played... a member of Boilermakers' 1999 Sweet 16 team and starter for 2000 Elight Eight team... two-time academic All-American, earned doctorate in history... played professionally for three seasons in Estonia, Australia and the CBA... spent five seasons from 2008-2013 as head coach at Andrean, winning four sectionals and one regional, 2013-2018 head coach of Carroll College (MT), winning two conference championships and two conference tournament titles... since 2018 is the head coach of NCAA Division I Incarnate Word in San Antonio... married with six children, he resides in San Antonio, Texas.

Averaged 27.2 points, 10.1 rebounds and 5.0 assists as junior, earning AP, IBCA and Bloomington H-T all-state honors... was a member of teams that went 75-27, including two sectional championships, a regional title, and three SWIAC conference titles... he was two-time SWIAC Player of the Year, Area Player of the Year and Terre Haute all-area... set Butler University record by playing in 121 career games, a member of teams that were 90-39 with three NCAA Tournament appearances... 491 career points, 2000 team Mental Attitude Award, Academic All-Conference and led Midwest Collegiate Conference in FT% (91%)... received degree in finance and for 20 years has worked at Graves Construction Services, where he is Vice President... married with three children, he resides in Switz City.

1996 Indiana All-Star, AP 2nd team all-state, IBCA 2nd team all-state, Bloomington H-T 1st team all-state and Indianapolis News 2nd team all-state... averaged 23.0 points, 9.6 rebounds and 68% FG for 21-3 team as a senior... all-state selection as a junior, averaging 22.0 points, 9.0 rebounds and 68% FG for 20-6 regional championship team... averaged 18.0 points and 8.2 rebounds as sophomore and 12.1 points and 7.6 rebounds as freshman... a member of teams that went 74-21, winning two sectionals, one regional and three conference titles... played two seasons at University of Akron, averaging 9.4 points and 6.3 rebounds as freshman and 5.6 points and 4.1 rebounds as sophomore... earned degree in computer science and has worked the past 16 years for Altec Industries, where he is the area service manager for Michigan and Ohio... married with one child, he resides in Fort Wayne.

1996 Indiana All-Star, AP 2nd team all-state, IBCA 2nd team all-state, Bloomington H-T small school all-state and Indianapolis News 3rd team all-state... averaged 16.8 points, 8.9 assists and 4.0 steals as senior for 21-3 team... led state in assists as junior (9.1 apg) and sophomore (8.4 apg) and set Indiana state record with 777 career assists... set school records in career, season and game assists and career, season and game steals, including single-game bests of 20 assists and 10 steals... a member of teams that went 74-21, winning two sectionals, one regional and three conference titles... career totals of 1,161 points, 777 assists and 410 steals... won John Wooden Award with Indiana All-Stars... was a three-year starter and two-time captain at Ball State... career totals of 424 points, 271 assists and 172 steals in 112 career games... led the Mid-American Conference twice in assist-to-turnover ratio, was member of two MAC West division champions, one MAC Tournament championship and Ball State's 2000 NCAA Tournament team... career in coaching included head boys coach at Wes-Del, Lakeview Christian, Alexandria and the Elwood girls, three years on staff at Ball State and one year assistant at Anderson University... since 2015, he is athletic director at Alexandria... married with seven children, he resides in Alexandria.

MICHAEL LEWIS

1996 Indiana All-Star, Gatorade Indiana Player of the Year, runner-up for Mr. Basketball, consensus 1st team all-state (AP, IBCA, Bloomington H-T and Indianapolis News), averaging a state-best 31.5 points per game for 20-8 regional champions... graduated as the 13th highest scorer in IHSAA history - 2,168 points set Jasper record and set school record with 882 points in one season and single-season scoring average... a member of teams that went 70-25, winning two conference titles, two sectionals, a regional and the 1995 Hall of Fame Classic, he led Dubois County in scoring three times and as a three-time Evansville all-area and three-time all-conference selection... his career at Indiana University concluded as the Hoosiers' all-time leader in career assists (545) and single-game assists (15), after leading the team in assists as a sophomore, junior and senior... his career totals include 887 points, 326 rebounds, 545 assists and 117 steals in 127 games and he was a team captain and 3rd team all-Big Ten... entering coaching, he was a graduate assistant at Texas Tech and assistant coach at Stephen F. Austin, Eastern Illinois (6 seasons), Butler University (5 seasons), University of Nebraska (3 seasons) and enters his 2nd season as an assistant at UCLA... married with two daughters, he resides in Calabasas, California.

JASPER**BRIAN McCAULEY**

1996 AP high honorable mention all-state... averaged 14 points, 3 assists and 2 steals per game as senior for 24-2 regional champions, ranked #1 in Indiana that won Wildkats 1st undefeated North Central Conference championship... averaged 12 points and 3.6 assists per game as junior on 22-4 team that won a regional championship... totaled 706 points on teams that were 61-14 over three seasons... two-year team co-MVP, 1996 IBCA All-Star, North-South All-Star and Top 40 Workout participant... played in 134 games in four years at Olivet Nazarene University, setting the school record with 258 career 3FG made... he totaled 1,339 career points, 324 rebounds and 289 assists on teams that were 107-40 with four NAIA national tournament appearances... was 1997 CCAC Freshman of the Year and 2000 Academic All-American as co-captain of 30-9 NAIA Final Four team... a teacher and coach, he was head coach of Kokomo from 2006-2014 and head coach of Noblesville from 2015-2018, with 192-116 record, including five sectional championships, three North Central Conference titles and 2011 4A state runners-up... he was three-time NCC Coach of the Year, 2011 IBCA District Coach of the Year and 2011 Indiana Junior All-Star coach... married with two children, he resides in Noblesville.

1996 Indiana All-Star, AP high honorable mention all-state and Bloomington H-T 1st team all-state... averaged 14.3 points and 12.5 rebounds, shooting 51.3% from the field as senior for 17-4 squad... totaled 993 career points... all-area 1st team... played in 97 games in three seasons at Purdue University, totaling 425 points, 327 rebounds and 74 blocks... led Big Ten with 36 games played as sophomore, when he averaged career bests 6.0 points and 4.6 rebounds per game... was among Big Ten leaders in blocks in 1997 and 1998... diagnosed with leukemia in March 2000, he passed away from the disease in August 2002 at the age of 24.

1996 Indiana All-Star, AP honorable mention all-state, IBCA 3rd team all-state, Bloomington H-T 1st team all-state... averaged 16.3 points and 11.3 rebounds and shot 62% from the field as senior for 17-4 squad... career totals of 1,068 points and 597 rebounds for teams that went 64-22 with a sectional championship... played junior college at the University of Southern Idaho ... 1st team NJCAA all-region as sophomore after averaging 15.2 points and 8.5 rebounds per game ... started 54 of 67 games played in two seasons at Purdue, averaging 10.5 points and 5.3 rebounds as junior and 8.3 points and 5.5 rebounds as senior for their NCAA Elite Eight team... Purdue totals of 628 points and 362 rebounds... played professionally overseas... he resides in Gary.

1996 AP high honorable mention all-state... averaged 10 points and 5.3 rebounds per game as senior for 1996 state champions... three-year varsity player for Giants and starter on back-to-back state championship teams, totaling 506 career points and 217 rebounds... averaged 6 points per game as junior for 32-1 state champs... nominated for McDonald's All-American Game, 2nd team all-state, all-Marion County, all-metro team, all-sectional, all-regional, all-semistate and all-state finals... played three seasons at Embry Riddle University, totaling 674 points, 288 rebounds, 165 assists and 98 steals on teams that went 81-28, winning three conference championships and the 2000 NAIA National Championship... he is a material services sales director for Boeing Global Services in Plano, Texas... he resides in Dallas.

1996 Indiana All-Star and consensus 1st team all-state selection (AP, IBCA, Bloomington H-T and Indianapolis News)... averaged 21.6 points, 7.6 rebounds, 3.2 assists and 2.7 steals per game as senior for 24-4 state runner-up Bulldogs... career totals of 1,087 points, 470 rebounds, 263 assists and 180 steals on teams that were 69-11 over three seasons with one Hoosier Hills Conference, three sectional, two regional and two semi-state titles and 1994 and 1996 state finals appearances... named Hoosier Hills all-conference and 4th in Mr. Basketball voting... averaged 12.1 points per game and named MAC Newcomer of the Year as freshman at Ball State for MAC champions... was Junior College National Player of the Year as sophomore at Barton County (KS) Community College, averaging 24.2 points and 7.3 rebounds for 35-3 national runners-up... finished career at Louisiana State University starting 41 games in two seasons, averaging 10.9 points and 4.6 rebounds as junior for NCAA Sweet 16 team and 10.2 points, 3.5 rebounds and 4.7 assists as senior and named SEC all-defensive team... college career total of 1,560 points... played professionally from 2002-2011 in Czech Republic, Argentina, Romania, China, Venezuela and Mexico... since 2016 he is a production supervisor with Reynolds Consumer Products in Louisville... he has four children and resides in New Albany.

1996 Indiana All-Star, AP high honorable mention all-state, IBCA 2nd team all-state and Indianapolis News 2nd team all-state... averaged 20.4 points and 9.4 rebounds as senior for 24-2 sectional and conference champions... career totals of 1,132 points, 655 rebounds, 236 assists and 125 steals on teams that were 53-14 after averaging 15.9 points and 8.7 rebounds as junior and 14.2 points and 11.4 rebounds as sophomore... three-time team MVP, three-time all Marion County, three-time all-conference and 1996 Indianapolis Player of the Year... played two seasons at Vincennes University, averaging 12.8 points and 4.7 assists as freshman and 13.9 points and 4.3 assists as sophomore, totaling 918 points and leading team in assists both years, with 59-13 record and two junior college national tournament appearances... played one season at Tennessee State University, averaging 13.3 points and 5.8 rebounds per game.... Hoosier Basketball Magazine 1st team all-state and pictured on the cover of HBM... averaged 18.5 points, 8.9 rebounds and 3.4 steals per game as senior for 18-6 Mid-Southern Conference and sectional champions... totaled 1,294 points, 761 rebounds, 253 assists and 151 blocks in four years for teams that went 62-29 with three Mid-Southern Conference champions and three Madison sectional championships... averaged 19.8 points, 8.0 rebounds, 3.3 assists and 2.9 steals as junior on 20-3 sectional and conference championship team and 14.2 points and 7.9 rebounds as sophomore... he was three-time all-conference, two-time MSC MVP, three-time all-sectional, sectional MVP, two-time all-regional, two-time Scott County Shootout MVP, 1996 East-West All-Star and Top 40 Workout participant... played in 61 games at the University of Southern Indiana, including their 23-5 GLVC champion team in 1997 and 27-6 team in 1998, both of which played in the NCAA Division II national tournament... he has worked with the Evansville Vanderburgh School Corporation for 19 years, 11 years as Evansville City Councilman and City County President, and for the past eight years has been Chairman of the Indiana State Board of Education... married with two children, he resides in Evansville.
